Dr. Ananda Mallawatantri

Ananda Mallawatantri is a recognized leader in sustainable development with over 30 years of experience across international and national organizations. He has held senior roles with United States Agency for International Development, United Nations Development Programme, and the International Union for Conservation of Nature, as well as contributions to the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce and the Presidential Secretariat of Sri Lanka. His expertise spans disaster management, energy transition, green finance, climate resilience, conservation, and corporate sustainability. He holds a BSc in Chemistry and a Diploma in Business Administration from the University of Colombo, an MSc in Environmental Science, and a PhD in Soil Physics from Washington State University, USA, earned as a Fulbright Scholar.



Ms. Azusa Kubota

Azusa Kubota joined the United Nations Development Programme in Sri Lanka as Resident Representative in January 2023. Before this appointment, she served as UNDP Resident Representative in Bhutan from 2019 to 2022, leading programme implementation, strategic planning, and country operations. She has also held leadership roles with UNDP in the Solomon Islands, Lao PDR, and the Maldives, in addition to working with UNDP's Independent Evaluation Office on country and thematic evaluations across regions. Ms. Kubota began her UNDP career in Malawi in 2002 and has previous experience with NGOs and international training programmes in the United States and Africa. A national of Japan, she holds a Master's Degree from Columbia University and a Bachelor's Degree from Smith College.



Hon. Dr. Dammika Patabendi

Dilhan C. Fernando is the younger son of Dilmah Founder Merrill J. Fernando. A graduate of the London School of Economics and Chairman of Dilmah Tea, as Trustee of the Merrill J. Fernando Foundation, and Director of Dilmah Conservation he directs the fulfillment of his father's unique commitment to serving humanity and environment through business. Dilhan serves as Chair of UN Global Compact Network Sri Lanka and Biodiversity Sri Lanka, a pioneering environmental collaboration amongst the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce, IUCN and Dilmah Conservation.



Dr. Hans Wijayasuriya

Hans Wijayasuriya is the Chief Advisor to the President of Sri Lanka on Digital Economy and Chairman of the Information and Communication Technology Agency. He previously served as Group Executive Director and CEO of Telecommunications Business at Axiata Group, where he led pan-regional telecom operations across multiple Asian markets. With over 30 years of experience in the telecommunications industry, he has held senior leadership roles for more than two decades and has been widely recognized for his contributions to the global digital and mobile sector, including awards from the GSM Association. He has also served on several international and national boards, including GSMA-related bodies, and played a key role in Sri Lanka's ICT sector development.

He holds a PhD in Digital Mobile Communications from the University of Bristol, a degree from the University of Cambridge, and an MBA from the University of Warwick.



Mr. Kamal Rohitha Uduwawala

Kamal Rohitha Uduwawala is a Special Grade officer of the Sri Lanka Administrative Service and currently serves as Secretary to the Ministry of Environment. He also serves as Chairman of the Sri Lanka Climate Fund and as a member of the Governing Council of the Sri Lanka Institute of Local Government. A Physics graduate of University of Peradeniya, he also holds a Master's Degree in Organizational Leadership from Monash University and has contributed to research and innovation, including patented electronic devices. Over his distinguished public service career, he has held several senior leadership positions in education, higher education, public administration, and pharmaceutical regulation, while also contributing to national committees on science, technology, climate, energy, and COVID-19 response.



Dr. Lalanath de Silva, PhD, LL.M

Lalanath de Silva is the Executive Director of the Environmental Law Alliance Worldwide and a seasoned public interest environmental lawyer with decades of international experience. He previously practiced in Sri Lanka's private bar for over 20 years, served as a legal consultant to the Ministry of Environment, and was a member of the national Law Commission. His global leadership includes senior roles at Transparentem, where he worked on supply chain accountability, and as the first Head of the Green Climate Fund's Independent Redress Mechanism, where he established its systems and procedures. He has also served with the United Nations Compensation Commission, World Resources Institute, and the Asian Development Bank. He holds a PhD from the University of Sydney and an LL.M from the University of Washington, and is also trained as a mediator.



Dr. Leonie Vaas

Leonie Vaas is the General Manager of Group Sustainability at Hirdaramani Group, where she leads sustainability strategy and implementation across Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, Ethiopia, and Vietnam. With over 17 years of experience in the apparel and textile sector, she is recognized internationally for her leadership in responsible production and was named a UN SDG Pioneer in 2021. She holds a PhD in Sustainability Management from IIC University of Technology, an MBA from Cardiff Metropolitan University, and is a chemical engineer certified by the Engineering Council UK. She also holds professional certifications including Lean Six Sigma Black Belt, GRI Standards, and ISO 14001 Lead Auditor. In addition to her corporate role, she serves as a visiting lecturer in sustainability at the University of Moratuwa and is a frequent international speaker on sustainability and industry transformation.

After returning to Sri Lanka, he served in several senior government and regulatory positions, including Chairman of the Board of Investment, Sri Lanka Ports Authority, Petroleum Development Authority, and Ceylon Petroleum Corporation, as well as leadership roles in Port City and petroleum storage entities. He also contributed to national energy sector reforms, supporting the development of the Electricity Act 2024. In the private sector, he co-chairs the Energy Committee of the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce and serves on multiple corporate boards.



Mr. Sanath Manatunge

Sanath Manatunge is a senior Sri Lankan banking professional and Fellow of multiple global and local professional bodies, including the Chartered Institute of Management Accountants (UK) and the Institute of Bankers of Sri Lanka. He holds an MBA from the University of Sri Jayawardenepura and an MSc in Sustainable Management from the University of Bedfordshire. With over 36 years of experience in banking, he has held senior leadership roles at the Commercial Bank of Ceylon, including Executive Director and Chief Operating Officer before becoming Managing Director and CEO. Ms. Shannon Cowlin

Shannon Cowlin is the Country Director of the Asian Development Bank Sri Lanka Resident Mission, where she leads the Bank's operations in the country and manages a portfolio of approximately \$2.81 billion. She serves as the primary liaison with the Government of Sri Lanka, private sector stakeholders, development partners, and civil society, and oversees the implementation of the Country Partnership Strategy 2024–2028 focused on resilient and inclusive economic recovery. Her expertise spans investment project management, policy dialogue, and knowledge work in energy, climate change, environment, air quality, public health, and the energy–food–water nexus. Prior to her current role, she served as ADB Country Director for Mongolia, leading strategy and operations from 2023. Ms. Shayani Weeresinghe

Shayani Weeresinghe is an Environmental Scientist with over 13 years of experience in sustainable finance, environmental policy, ESG investment strategy, and EU-funded technical cooperation. She is currently a Sustainable Business Specialist at Expertise France, supporting the EU-funded Green Recovery Facility in Sri Lanka (EUR 5 million, 2023–2027), focusing on policy reform, investment climate improvement, and sustainable finance mechanisms.

She has led EU Horizon 2020 science and technology cooperation programmes on disaster resilience and supported Global Affairs Canada initiatives on gender-responsive governance. Her experience includes ESG investment research at Moody's Analytics and ESG fintech and regtech innovation at RS Metrics. Mr. Shiran Fernando

Shiran Fernando is the Secretary General/CEO of The Ceylon Chamber of Commerce, having previously served as Chief Economic Policy Advisor and Chief Economist. In his earlier role, he led the Chamber's Economic Intelligence Unit, focusing on economic research and policy advocacy, and served on its Steering Committee on Economic Policy.
